

08 Canmore, Millennium

After the immediate success of the Nordic Center in Canmore, Alberta the town started work on the process' to develop Skills Parks within their own town limits.



Staff and council worked collectively and supported the project which identified the need for two parks, one north and one south of the town that made access easy and allowed opportunity for kids of all ages.





During the design phase the Town had some very specific criteria that needed to be met and then the brought in the local bike club and 'key opinion leaders' to help develop the final concepts.



Millennium was chosen to be built first and with a local top shelf contractor who had experience and incredible community network all challenges were met and the park was built ahead of schedule and ride able.



A community volley build day sponsored by the town and the club took place on the Sunday and tons of locals and people as far away as Edmonton showed up to help.



Millennium is a giant pump track with more options than you know what to even do. It has a easy and harder side with multiple option lines connected with flowing berms. The pump track is smooth and fast with loose and tight berms everywhere, by far the most complex pump track I have ever seen and Hoots has ever built.







To supplement the park, a small but fun technical line was installed in the treed area adjacent to the track. One side of the course is bridgework while the other side is log and the two textures combine to make one experience.
